Schroeder turned in a double finals victory, teaming with Victor Seixas of the University of North Carolina to win an uphill battle for the men's singles title, beating Jiroslav Drobny and his fellow Czech, Vladimir Cernik, 4-6, 6-8, 6-4, 6-2, 6-0.

Louise Brough of Beverly Hills, California, and Mrs. Margaret Dupont, Wilmington, Delaware, breezed to an easy 6-3, 6-2, win in the women's doubles, downing Mrs. Kovacs and Shella Summers of South Africa. It was the seventh national championship for the pair.
