Dear Mr. McCormick:

I send you herewith the analytical results on the blood and urine
of your employee, Mr. [REDACTED].

The lead concentrations in both blood and urine are well above normal levels. They indicate clearly that this man has had a recent potentially hazardous exposure to lead compounds. There is more than the usual discrepancy between the lead levels in the blood and urine, but it will be noted that the urinary sample is concentrated, and this is probably responsible for the relatively high lead concentration. In any case, the lead concentration in the blood is well above safe limits, and if there were clinical evidence of intoxication, these results would justify the diagnosis of lead intoxication.
