Dear Mr. Cameron:

Dr. Greenburg has shown me your letter of January 21, and I think we ought to give considerable thought to the procedure to be followed in the organization of the committee on sandblasting, as it may serve as a precedent for the future.

I think it is quite clear that we can not expect people like Greenburg and Bloomfield who are among the leading experts in this special field in the country to work under the direction of Dr. Sappington, and the same problem will arise in other cases as Dr. Sappington can not possibly expect to be an expert on all the very technical phases of research which may come up. On the other hand, I see clearly the need for a good administrative tieup. I would like to make the following suggestion, which, if approved, could be presented by Mr. Sanford at the February meeting.

It seems to me the proper way to proceed would be to enlarge Dr. Greenburg's committee to include industrial and other representatives up to a total of about twenty (carefully avoiding Pittsills), having Greenburg chairman of the committee and Sanford and myself members with Sappington as the secretary of the committee. Do you not think this would make an adequate setup?
