The place of meeting of this organization and that of the National Conference of Governmental Industrial Hygienists in 1945 remains undecided. Up to now, the question has been under consideration on the assumption that these organizations will meet in conjunction with the American Association of Industrial Physicians and Surgeons and the American Association of Industrial Nurses, as in St. Louis this year.

Due to the requirements of the commercial exhibitors, as well as the fact that it is apparently planned to run concurrent sessions in such a manner that many of us will be unable to attend the presentation of important papers, it appears that serious consideration should be given to the proposal that this organization and the NCGIH meet together in 1945 independently from the AAIP&S and the AAIN. If this were done, the question of suitable accommodations for our meetings would be enormously simplified since there would be no commercial exhibits to be considered.

I am accordingly placing this question before the Board of Directors of our Association and Mr. Bowditch is placing it before the Executive Committee of the NCGIH in an identical letter. It will be recalled that our Board of Directors voted in favor of a meeting in New York in 1945.

Your careful consideration and early reply to this question is requested.
