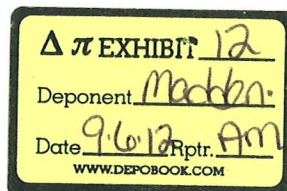

Reichhold Chemicals, Inc. hereinafter "Reichhold"
responds to Plaintiffs' Interrogatories to Defendants.

GENERAL OBJECTIONS

Reichhold objects to these interrogatories on the grounds that they do not state any specific time period for which responses are sought. 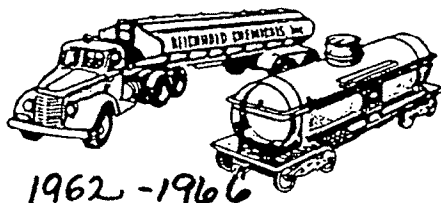
