A spokesman for the company says the amounts of PCB were minute and were well below the contamination levels set by The Environmental Protection Agency. The soil was taken from the yard outside the utility's Boulder Service Center, where some transformers and capacitors were stored. Some of them contained PCB, which has been proved to be a cancer-causing agent."

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
