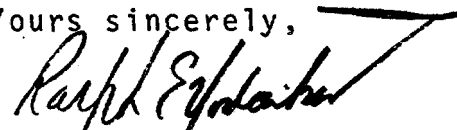
Dear Dr. Kehoe:
