Your letter of August 9 in regard to the rules and regulations meets with my full approval. The change which Mr. Walter suggested is entirely correct and proper for I, of course, did not mean to indicate pipe lines carrying Ethyl Gasoline but only those used for carrying Ethyl Fluid.

I am glad to hear that you are going to use the rules and regulations in connection with the sales manual, but I agree with you that other copies should be printed for the use of customers and other interested persons. In fact, I have a number of requests on my desk now for copies of our rules and regulations, which I thought it best to hold up until the new ones are printed. It does not seem likely that there will be any great changes in these rules and regulations for some time, so that two thousand copies will certainly not be too many.
