EFFICACY OF REHABILITATION IN CHRONIC OBSTRUCTIVE LUNG DISEASE: A PROSPECTIVE STUDY OF MORBIDITY AND COST/BENEFIT OUTCOMES FOR AN IN-HOSPITAL PROGRAM. G.P. DeFLORIO, N.R. Johnson, A. Hoyt and M.A. Gunderson. Barlow Hospital, Los Angeles, CA.

An ongoing prospective study of the efficacy of an intensive in-hospital program of comprehensive pulmonary rehabilitation was initiated by Barlow Hospital and the California Department of Health in October 1976. This report presents some of the initial findings of the study regarding efficacy and probable cost/benefit outcomes. Determination of the effect of rehabilitation upon acute morbidity episodes and associated costs as measured by hospital days before and after rehabilitation is of major importance in chronic obstructive lung disease rehabilitation program planning. Study findings of an initial cohort of 96 patients with a mean age of 65.2 years and mean FEV₁ of 0.87 liters are strongly positive and consistent with major objectives of the program. Acute hospitalization rates post-rehabilitation are markedly decreased. Projected post-hospitalization rate is 44.8% of the prior year period, or an estimated decrement of 23.4 days per year in the first year for patients at severe levels of deficit. Cost/benefit outcome projections correcting for disease specific mortality have been prepared based upon preliminary data and suggest positive outcomes of sufficient magnitude to be of major fiscal importance for program planning if sustained for longer periods. The potential program/fiscal importance of present trend findings when applied to point prevalence estimates of equivalent target populations has been examined for California and nationally.

Pulmonary Manifestations of Vinyl and Polyvinyl Chloride Exposures. Stephen L. Deneter, M.D., and E.M. Cordasco, M.D. Cleveland Clinic Foundation, Cleveland, Ohio.

Newer varieties of occupational lung diseases have been recently reported primarily due to the vast increase in industrial technology. Pre-eminent among such newer agents are; vinyl chloride (VC) and polyvinyl chloride. Very few cases have been reported (Europe only) with descriptive histopathological changes. To our knowledge, no pathological studies have been described in the American literature as the result of VC exposure. The abnormalities in our patient biopsied disclosed interstitial and alveolar macrophage reactions with multinucleated giant cells, desquamation of macrophages into the alveolar lumina and minor alveolar inflammatory changes. The study includes clinical and laboratory evaluation of four patients with varying clinical manifestations with asthma in two patients and interstitial lung disease in two other patients. Pulmonary function abnormalities will be described and chest x-ray illustrations will be characterized. Preventive therapy consisted of the avoidance of further exposures, and frequent industrial hygiene monitoring. Specific therapy for the asthmatic patients employed theophyllin, cromolyn sodium in one individual, high flow oxygen, and corticosteroids. Thus far, none of these patients have exhibited evidence of pulmonary neoplasm. All four patients survived their occupational injuries and two are still disabled to varying degrees. Salient historical aspects of the problems will be discussed.
