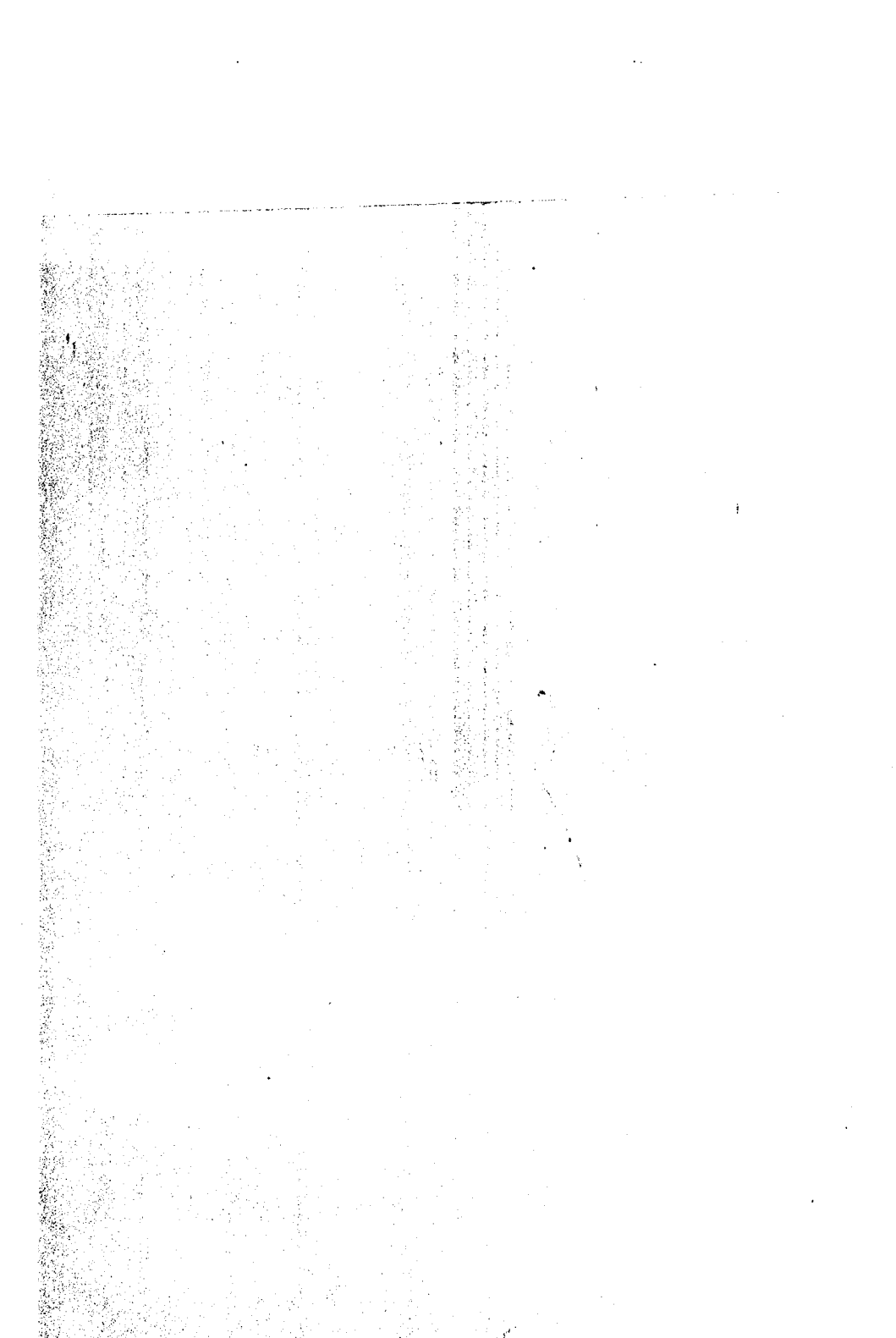

Dear Doctor de Villiers:

I have received the London office of the Associated Ethyl Co that you are willing to undertake the medical examination of workmen who will be engaged in mixing Ethyl leaded gasoline at the Shell plant at Port

I am very happy to approve of this arrangement and under separate cover am sending you a series of articles which have come out of this laboratory in relation to the problems from the manufacture, distribution and use of Ethyl gasoline. You have already received from Mr. M. a folder with various types of information concerning the operation of mixing plants, together with a copy of the regulations and a copy of a medical memorandum prepared for the use of consultants of the

I believe you will receive all of the necessary information in the articles which are being supplied to you and I need not dwell further. Suffice it to say that if the men work with care in accordance with the regulations, there will be no difficulties. Consequently the medical job will be stimulating the carrying out of proper precautions by studying the men with such care as to determine any evidences of carelessness or accidental exposure.

Concerning the physical examinations, it is our practice to examine thoroughly each time he is visited, and to make an account of all of the physical and laboratory findings. In addition to a carefully taken clinical history and a thorough physical examination, we are in the habit of examining the blood at least as to its hemoglobin content together with a blood film which is examined for abnormalities of any kind, but specifically for stippling. We also carry out an examination of the reaction which in all cases covers the reaction, the absence of albumin and a microscopic examination if this is indicated.
