Both lung fields show considerable granular thickening of the root shadows in both perihilar areas along with discrete millary densities. These changes were noted on examination 4-15-61. A direct comparison with the previous films would be important to determine the progress of this disease.

CONCLUSIONS

Pulmonary occupational disease probably asbestosis.

REFEREE: It appearing that Applicant's employment by the Philip Carey Manufacturing Co. was out of state under a contract of employment which was not made in the State of California, and GOOD CAUSE APPEARING THEREFOR, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

Philip Carey Manufacturing Company, and General Accident Fire & Life Assurance Corp. Ltd., be and they are hereby dismissed.

GOOD CAUSE APPEARING THEREFOR, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

Lawrence Des Laurier and L. L. Des Laurier Company and Guarantee Insurance Company, and Firemans Fund Insurance Company be and they are hereby dismissed as parties defendant.

DISPOSITION: Fifteen days to the parties for further filing, including points and authorities; seven days, thereafter, for rebuttal; matter then to stand submitted.

SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

APPLICANT testified that he is working now doing asbestos work. It does not involve much physical activity. He is working on the tar pot.

With regard to his physical restrictions, he has a hard time doing anything because of shortness of breath. He cannot climb a flight of stairs without stopping. He can walk about six hundred feet without stopping, at a medium pace. He can be on his feet all day long. He cannot climb, but he can work on a six or eight foot ladder. In 1968, he has worked for about three months. H

He drew UCD benefits in 1968. He started drawing such benefits in November, 1967, when he went to the hospital. He did not work from November, 1967, until September, 1968. His last day of work was November 11, 1967, and he returned to work on about September 21, 1968. He was sick during that period. Since September, 1968, he has had about six jobs. He gets laid off. He cannot do the work because he cannot climb.

He is receiving medical treatment for his lung condition from Dr. Crantz. He has paid all of the bills for medication. His condition is getting worse.

On Cross-examination by Mr. McMillan, Applicant testified that he has read his deposition and it is correct to the best of his recollection.

(Applicant's Attorney stated that Applicant's income tax returns show earnings of \$10,023 in 1965, and \$12,713 in 1966.)

He received unemployment insurance benefits for four weeks preceding September 21, 1968. He is working at Standard Oil Now for Associated Insulation Company. He has been working for five days there.

He worked for Armstrong Cork in Beverly, Ohio, but also out here. He got the jobs through the union. His work in 1955 was in California, but his work for Armstrong Cork in 1953 and 1954 was in Ohio. His work for Johns Manville Company was in California.

His work for C. F. Braun and Johns Manville was not on board ship. Armstrong Contracting and Supply is the same as Armstrong Cork. He did not work on board ship for that company in 1961. His work for Coast Insulating Products Company in 1965 and 1966 was in California. His work for Larentzen in 1963 and 1964 was ship repair work. His work for Insulation Services in 1965 and 1964 was in Walnut Creek, California.

He does not remember seeing a chest specialist in Oakland in 1964.

On Cross-examination by Mr. Thomas, Applicant testified that when working for Owens Corning Fiberglass, from 1955 to 1962, he was using fiber glass insulation but also asbestos. It is difficult to say how much of the time was spent in using either material. He did not necessarily use fiber glass more than asbestos.

While working for Western MacArthur Company, he used fiber glass and asbestos.

His work for Mundet Cork was back east. He was hired back east for that job.

His work for Owens Corning Fiber Glass was in California, but about thirty per cent of that employment was aboard ship.

On Cross-examination on behalf of Mr. Sherbourne, Applicant testified that in 1968 his car turned over as a result of which he had a sprained neck. He was in the hospital for eight days. He received treatment for his neck and also for his lungs while in the hospital, Antioch Memorial Hospital. His neck and back were treated for about three days by Dr. Crantz. He did not have an appointment for the hospital prior to the accident.

In 1965 he had quit a job for Plant Asbestos because he couldn't climb. He quit several jobs because of this. He went to Attorney Smith's office in 1962 because of his lungs.

His work for Western Asbestos Company was in California. About twenty per cent of that employment involved repair work on ships. His work for Van Arsdale Harris was on ships.

On Cross-examination by Mr. Keenan, Applicant testified that he is able to handle a job which requires climbing a few stairs in the morning. His neck and back are not bothering him now. He was treated in 1966 or 1967 for a kink in his neck by Dr. Crantz. He has no trouble with his right knee now, nor with his low back. He did not receive treatment for nose bleeds now, nor since 1965.

His work for Western Fiber Glass in 1949 was in California, as was his work for Bay Cities Asbestos in 1948 and 1949. His work for Plant Asbestos Company was in California.

On Cross-examination by Mr. Sciaroni, Applicant testified that his work for Fibreboard in 1947 and 1948 was in Antioch. He does not remember working for Fibreboard; he remembers working for Plant Rubber and Asbestos Company which was owned by Fibreboard. That work was on ships which were being repaired. He worked for two months at the Mark Hopkins Hotel for Plant Rubber and Asbestos Company.

The ship work he did for Armstrong was on new destroyers, not on ships under repair.

On Cross-examination by Mr. Hays, Applicant testified that he came to California in 1945. He took a traveler in 1943 and spent two years back east. He returned to California in 1950 and stayed two years. He then went back east until 1954. He engaged in asbestos work back east.

He has used a respirator ever since 1944. He used a respirator on all California jobs. The respirators are not very good. They

cover the mouth and nose. He did not notice any shortness of breath prior to 1944. He first noticed shortness of breath in 1961. He saw Attorney Smith in 1962, for his shortness of breath.

On Cross-examination by Mr. Wilkes, Applicant testified that he worked for Fluor Corporation at the Union Oil Company, at Oleum in 1955, 1956, and 1957. This was asbestos work. His earnings at that time were about \$5 per hour.

On further Direct Examination, Applicant testified that his employment with Armstrong Cork Company in 1951 was out of state. His employment in 1953 was out of state. His employment with Thorpe and Plant, in 1953, were in California, but his employment with Armstrong was back east. He returned to California in 1954. He worked for Armstrong on ships at Bethlehem Steel. He worked for Kircher in Arizona and then came to California. The work he did for Armstrong prior to his employment with Kircher was out of state.
