Ben-Zvi to Run Again
JERUSALEM, Oct. 18—(AP)—President Izhak Ben-Zvi of Israel agreed today to stand for re-election. His five-year term expires Dec. 9.

Delegates also generally agreed that inflation is perhaps the greatest single problem facing the free world's economy, according to Dr. Weldon B. Gibson, associate director of Stanford Research Institute. He acted as the other reporter for the roundtables.

Most of the delegates agreed that a fight against world inflation called for economic realism and political courage, but they also admitted inflation is likely to be around for a long time.

SOME INFLATION.

Some of the 500 delegates said they liked a "little inflation" since it promotes the growth of the economy.

—The "Buy America" Act, which the conference called "a product of the depression" and no longer necessary.

While much of the roundtable talk was of a positive nature, the final tone was set by Henry R. Luce, editor-in-chief of Time, Inc., and general chairman of the conference.

LUCE OPINIONS.

In the concluding address yesterday afternoon, he said:

"The United States has fallen short of its obvious and reasonable responsibilities. It has failed to do what could reasonably have been expected of it as the greatest economic power in history."

While the United States has made "one or two very serious" mistakes, Luce said, it has carried on its "primary assignment—to protect the world from catastrophic war where the line should be drawn and/or from Communist war between private investment

S. F. Delinquency at Peak

There were 282 youngsters at the Center yesterday.

—So overcrowded are the facilities that extra beds have been jammed into the Center's nine cottages. Isolation rooms, usually reserved for recalcitrant youngsters, are being used to house the overflow.

—A probation officer is averaging 94 cases involving problem boys, compared to an average of 85 for October of last year. The problem girl division is averaging 60 per officer, compared to 50 for last October. In child neglect cases, the average per month has soared to 99 cases per officer.

—In juvenile delinquency cases, auto thefts lead all others, followed by wardens, burglary, other thefts and immorality.

Strycula, predicting that the situation will get even worse, said that in his new budget for the coming fiscal year, which he will submit in days.

December, he will seek 12 additional probation officers.

He will be backed by Juvenile Court Judge Cronin, who termed the situation "dire." There had been no increase in the number of probation officers since 1948, although juvenile delinquency and child neglect cases have risen progressively.

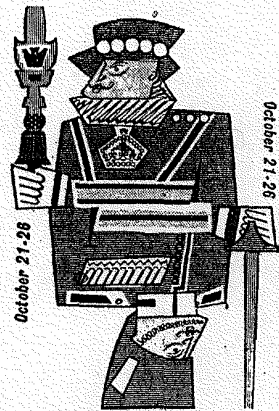
Strycula has repeatedly sought more probation officers, only to have them stricken from his budget.

Judge Cronin said more probation officers were vital, because they supervise, counsel and rehabilitate delinquent youngsters.

Strycula was hopeful that additional probation officers would ease the overcrowding at the Youth Guidance Center, by cutting down the cases housed there.

The normal stay for problem boys is 10 or 11 days; 13 to 14 days for problem girls. Child neglect cases customarily are housed there for 40 days, which he will submit in days.
