In drawing your attention to the dangers to health from exposure to Asbestos dust or fibres, we would point out that most of our products containing Asbestos fibres are produced with bonding agents, coatings or binders to render them safe for normal handling and usage.

As a further safeguard however, any products which carry an element of risk will be adequately labelled with the Asbestos Safety Symbol.
