Picture 2 - CHARLES HARDWOOD MEMORIAL COMPLEX, ST. CROIX- At the Main Building Entrance Area, there were various broken fluorescent lamps on the floor mixed with aluminum frames and ballasts without control or containment of Universal Wastes.

Picture 5 - CHARLES HARDWOOD MEMORIAL COMPLEX, ST. CROIX- At the Main Building Entrance Area, there were four (4) 55-gallon black steel drums with lids containing "Ballast" which were removed from aluminum frames. None of the drums were labeled as, "Universal Waste-Mercury Containing Equipment."

CROIX- At the 2nd Level Main Building Area, there were fifteen (15) square cardboard boxes (1'x1'x 4') packing over sixty (60) 4-foot spent fluorescent lamps, some open, other containing broken lamps, and not labeled as, "Universal Waste," or dated.
