He pointed out, however, that under the law passed by the 1935 Legislature, the Board of Prison Terms and Paroles has the power to "redetermine" sentences of prisoners. The maximum term for criminal assault is 50 years. Sefton said the latter board might "redetermine" Boesen's sentence and fix it at 50 instead of 25 years. Prior to 1935, the Board of Prison Terms and Paroles could fix a sentence only once under the "indeterminate sentence" law.
