However, a compromise between the opposing homeowners on the Meyer St. side of the proposed project was reached when the applicants, David and Joseph Paradis, agreed to put up a 6-ft. high concrete block wall and create a buffer zone between the northeast side of the shop and the center and neighboring residences.

However, most of the homeowners on Lazard St. are believed to be still opposed to the facility because of the proximity to the center, an official said. Commissioners recommended approval of the zone change.

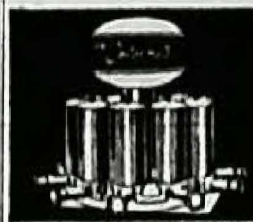
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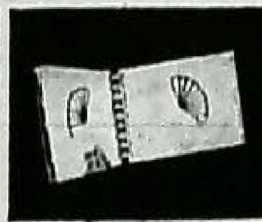
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
