Dear Sir:

We have your report relative to your investigation of atmospheric load conditions in our plant which we have studied very carefully. My purpose in writing you is to keep you informed as to just exactly what we are doing. As you probably know, we have been working through Dr. Kehoe of the Lettering Laboratories of the University of Cincinnati, Cincinnati, Ohio. Some years ago your Department recommended that we contact Dr. Kehoe, M. D., who has spent many years studying industrial diseases. The Lettering Laboratories had sent a man up to take tests similar to yours even prior to your investigation. In addition, since that time, Mr. Roberts, who is an engineer with the Lettering Laboratories, visited our plant for the purpose of making further recommendations. As soon as we have received Mr. Roberts' reports we would like to call you in and discuss this whole matter in detail with you. In addition, we would like to work very closely with you in determining the effects of various improvements which we intend to install. We feel it would be well to make periodic tests during the time that the changes are made so that we can determine just how effective they are and also determine any further changes that may be necessary. For example, as our Mr. Salomon explained to you, we are planning on using the Bravo units for supplying fresh heated air into the foundry. We would like very much to have you work with us to determine where these units would be located and the effect it has on the overall atmospheric condition in the foundry.

We hope we may feel free to call upon you for advice at any time. It is our intention to combine the information received from you with that received from Dr. Kehoe for the best results.
