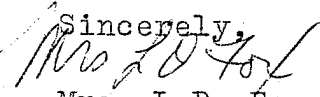

In a recent publication of Today's Health magazine I read an article on Lead Poisoning, the dangers involved and your effort to educate the public in this matter. I recently discovered my child, age 2, playing with the enclosed dime store item-----a "jumping bean", one of several beans, whose movement is apparently caused by the lead ~~7~~ or magnetized metal pellet inside. These pellets fall out easily, and since they are manufactured for children as toys, I would assume a great many of them are consumed by children. I do not know if these pellets are lead or not or if they are dangerous to children, but I felt I should bring it to your attention just in case they are a hazard.

I would appreciate a response from you if at all possible since several children in the neighborhood have been playing with them.
