TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Today, Governor Rick Scott announced the appointment of Sonya Rood and Gary Nicklaus to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

Gary Nicklaus, 48, of Jupiter, succeeds Ronald Bergeron and is appointed for a term beginning December 1, 2017 and ending August 1, 2022.
