

The World Had Never Seen *this* Done Before

The world saw a piece of shooting last summer, the like of which it had never seen before: A ten-shot "possible" at 50 yards—*off-hand*!

Arthur Hubalek of Brooklyn is the shooter who covered himself with glory by accomplishing this phenomenal feat.

Hubalek, shooting U.S. .22 N. R. A.'s, made the record-breaking "possible" in the 50-Yard Off-Hand Match of the Central Sharpshooters' Tournament at St. Louis. Off-hand shooting seems to be a specialty not only with Hubalek but with two other .22 N. R. A. boosters—John Kaufman of

Voluntown, Conn., and Paul Landrock of Union Hill, N. J. Kaufman finished second to Hubalek in the 50-yard off-hand match at St. Louis, and at the same shoot carried off two firsts. Landrock, with a score of 1203 x 1250 on a standard 25-yard gallery target having a half-inch center, did himself proud in the 50-Yard Off-Hand Record Match during the Election Day Matches held at Rosedale, Long Island.

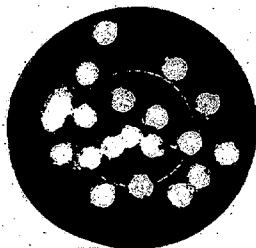
