CALIFORNIA BULLETIN ON LEAD POISONING IN INDUSTRY

The California State Department of Public Health recently issued a comprehensive bulletin on lead poisoning in industry. It covers concisely routes of absorption, type of poisoning, history, physical examination, laboratory data, therapy, prevention and control, and concludes with a small bibliography, which incidentally refers to the Proceedings of LIA's own Lead Hygiene Conference of 1958.

We believe that this would be useful to most people engaged in the handling of lead, its alloys and compounds.
