Lorch said the Indianapolis Clinic, to whom [REDACTED] was sent for treatment, had told him (Lorch) that [REDACTED] would undoubtedly have died if he had not been given correct diagnosis and treatment. In other words had the first doctor's diagnosis been allowed to stand as lead poisoning it would have been too bad.
