The Chairman, Mr. Sevick, opened this meeting of a special subcommittee of the Environmental Health Committee by reviewing the purpose for the meeting in accordance with action taken by the full Committee at its September 21, 1967 meeting. It was noted that the funds for continuation of this project into 1968 had been approved subject to the recommendations of a special subcommittee following its meeting with the contractor. Accordingly, this special meeting was being held, prior to a meeting with the contractor scheduled for the following day, for the purpose of reviewing the latest progress report on this project and to discuss (1) whether or not ILZRO should continue with this project, and (2) if so, the direction that such continuation should take.

It was reported that the program for the remainder of 1967 had been discussed previously by ILZRO and API with Isotopes, Inc., and it had been agreed that 44 more isotopic analyses will be made before the end of the year in addition to those already started. These 44 analyses will be made on the following samples:
