Dear Doctor McCutcheon:-

Following the request of Mr. J. W. Stewart of the Kendall Refining Company, we are sending you today the following containers for sampling blood and urine on [REDACTED] two tubes, one needle and one 250 cc bottle.

The needle is sterile and we recommend that the blood be taken through the needle directly into the tubes without the use of a syringe. Two tubes are provided into each of which we should like to have approximately 10 cc of blood, as these samples will be analyzed in duplicate. At the time of the venepuncture we should also like a small sample of urine. This can either be passed before or after the blood is taken. The sample should be passed directly into the bottle and the stopper immediately replaced. Our instructions for the collection of these samples are attached.

We would appreciate your sending us three blood smears on [REDACTED] these to be of moderate thickness.

We will advise you of the results of the analyses as soon as they are completed.
