No regular periodical is published, but manual sheets and "Chemical Safety Data Sheets" covering hazards, both within the industry and in the handling and transporting of its products by the consumer, are issued from time to time. These publications embody the best thinking of chemical safety engineers on the prevention of accidents in the handling of flammable, corrosive, or toxic materials. "Chem-Card" sheets cover recommendations for shipping containers, methods of storage, and safe unloading procedures.

Mine Inspectors' Institute of America

The institute is composed of "all men commissioned by a state, commonwealth, province, county, or by a foreign nation to act as mine inspectors, or chief of a department of mines or minerals, all persons commissioned by the United States Government as director, assistant director, chief of any division of the Bureau of Mines, or as mine inspectors of any grade within the bureau of mines, all persons engaged in safety or responsible supervisory work in or around mines or in teaching safety pertaining to mines, all persons in a responsible position in the manufacture or distribution of equipment for the promotion and the preservation of safety for mines or mining employees, all persons in responsible positions with labor organizations of mining employees, and all mining safety and engineering employees of Mining and Workmen's Compensation Liability insurers."

The institute advocates uniformity of mining legislation and better protection of the lives and health of mine employees. Annual meetings discuss such subjects as mine ventilation, electrical hazards, mine safety, and causes of accidents.

Its annual publication is the *Proceedings of the MIIA*.
