Dear Dr. Kehoe,

May I express to you my appreciation of your consideration in coming to Savannah to testify in the tetra-ethyl case which we successfully concluded on yesterday. I do not know how we could have gotten along without your assistance in the preparation of the case and your testimony in the trial of the case.

During the trial, some of the Judges of the other Courts and some Savannah lawyers sat in the court room and they have expressed great admiration for the clear-cut and convincing manner in which you handled yourself on the witness stand. One of the Municipal Court judges told me, when you came down, that he did not think argument necessary, that the case had been won.
