Project 14 - comprehensive atmospheric project comprising ninety-five metal protective primers.

Project 19 - red lead and other metal protective paints on new and partially rusted galvanized steel and aluminum clad steel.

Project 20 - vinyl metal surface conditioners and anti-corrosive paints pigmented with red lead, zinc chromate and various other pigment materials exposed at tide level and totally immersed in sea water. Tide range panels not inspected as they were not showing enough change.

Project 21 - Re-run of the total immersion portion of Project 20.

Project 22 - Red lead formulations with litharge added in varying amounts.

Inspection reports will be submitted at a later date.

The inspection was concluded at 4:00 P.M. and the meeting recessed until the following morning.
