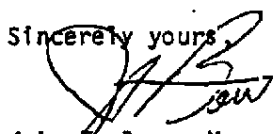
Dear Brian:

Cause of death per death cert.	Respiratory arrest Cirrhosis of liver - non-alcoholic Rheumatoid arthritis
Diagnosis of Angio	January 19, 1983 by Armed Forces Institute of Pathology. Reported to APCI June 1, 1984. Confirmed by consultants.
Work History	Normal progression from helper to senior operator, cleaned reactors, worked in stripping and recovery areas, as well as charging operator.
Other comments	Reports of thrombocytopenia and leukopenia since 1978. Gold treatment for arthritis in 1976 era, later refractory to therapy. Pedal edema and ascitis in September 1983. Past hepatitis A, but no B antibodies. Blood tests showed alpha-fetoprotein below 10, SGOT55, LDH 479, prolonged PT of 16. Under doctors care about 6 weeks before death, had passed standard physical examination 3 months earlier.

Dear Doctor Tepper:

I have reviewed the slides of [REDACTED] that you sent. They show an extensive angiosarcoma which is very vascular and very active. Unfortunately, truly uninvolved liver is nowhere to be seen so that if there was an underlying cirrhosis the hallmarks are now obliterated by the tumor. I do not think that the gold therapy given for the rheumatoid arthritis played any significant role in the extensive spread of this tumor.
