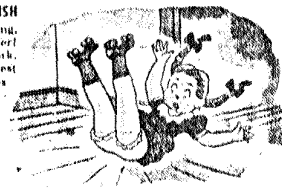

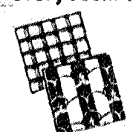

Because their sons and husbands are dead, missing in action or prisoners of war, parents and wives today had medals awarded at Hamilton field for the deeds of those servicemen on the field and in the service of battle.

The distinguished Flying Cross was given Mrs. Ida C. DeHaby, 1743 Cedar Street, Berkeley, posthumously for her son, First Lieut. Ralph C. DeHaby, for landing a bomber on rough seas so that all of the crew but him escaped successfully. He also received the Air Medal and Oak Leaf Cluster posthumously for ten missions.

Gallantry in action at Attu won the posthumous award of the Silver Star for Pvt. Edmund H. Barrios. It was received by his widow, Mrs. Barrios, of 626 Fulton Street, Oakland.

To Elmer Mitchell, 5852 Potlatch Boulevard, went the posthumous Silver Star award for his son, Staff Sgt. Mark A. Mitchell, for gallantry in action in a flight over Burma. His Air Medal, with Oak Leaf Cluster, also was presented to his father.

William D. Carter, 8 Panoramic Place, Berkeley, received the Air Medal for his son, Second Lt. Douglas Carter, missing in action, for night flights in an unarmored troop carrier at low altitude.

For Sgt. J. H. Bell, prisoner of war, Mrs. Bell, of 9520 Sunnyvale Street, Oakland, received the Air Medal, with Oak Leaf Cluster, OTHER AWARDS.

Larger gardens, but with fewer people planting them, was the Victory Gardens outlook for this year, on the basis of applications for special water rates made to the East Bay Municipal Utility District.

The acreage planned for this year apparently is about the same as last, according to Ruseo J. Jones, director, but fewer persons are planning to garden. The district has received approximately 11,000 applications this year as compared with 15,000 at the same time last year, while the total acreage comes to 345, just slightly below the figure for May 1, 1943.

Majority of applications, however, are expected in May and June.

Victory gardeners in Oakland already have filed 6,962 applications; Berkeley, 2046; Alameda, 576 and Richmond, 2,217. The average saving on water bills for the season will be \$3.92 per applicant on the basis of figures up to May 1.
