> Attached for your review is the final draft version of the
> minutes of our discussions of the Shanghai Health Study (SHS) at
> Asilomar last August, together with three attachments. The delay
> in sending this to you resulted from the need to follow up some
> of the exposure assessment issues that were raised at that
> meeting. This was accomplished in part by a meeting between Tom
> Armstrong and several of us who attended the Benzene 2004
> research symposium in Munich in October. A conference call in
> which several members of the SRP participated was conducted
> during the Munich meeting, and helped to clarify some of the
> exposure assessment issues, including limits of the extent to
> which precise measurements of current occupational benzene
> exposures can complement records of work histories and historical
> work practices and reported benzene levels years and even decades
> ago. Minutes of that conference call are appended.
> After reviewing the minutes and attachments, please reply with
> any revisions or additions by 10 January 2005. We will finalize
> the document and post it to the SHS website at that time.
>
> We will address the issue of the SRP's responsibility for
> pre-publication review of presentations and manuscripts for
> publication in a separate communication. We do have manuscripts
> from two of the SHS investigators that were presented in Munich
> in October (but not the third one). We will distribute these to
> members of both Panels for information and comments, but these
> papers were not received in time to review them before they were
> publicly presented.
