ANSWERS OF DEFENDANT JOHNS-MANVILLE SALES CORPORATION
TO INTERROGATORIES OF PLAINTIFFS

In accordance with the provisions of Rule 33, Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, Johns-Manville Sales Corporation, successor by merger with Johns-Manville Products Corporation, hereby answers the Interrogatories of Plaintiffs served on Defendant's counsel.

Defendant reserves the right to amend or supplement its Answers, if it finds that inadvertent omissions or errors have been made, or if additional or more accurate information becomes available.

1. State your correct name, age, residence, business address, occupation and relationship to Defendant, if any.

ANSWER: The following Interrogatories are answered by R. B. Von Wald, Vice President and Assistant General Counsel of Johns-Manville Sales Corporation, Ken-Caryl Ranch, Denver, Colorado.

2. Please state what products of Defendant manufactured, marketed, or distributed between 1952 and August, 1975 contain asbestos.

ANSWER: See Exhibit A attached hereto for a list of asbestos-bearing industrial thermal insulation products setting forth the years of production.

3. For each product listed in answer to the preceeding interrogatory, please state:

- a. The time period during which it was manufactured, marketed or distributed.
- b. The amount of sales of said products and time of said sales to the following entities:

ANSWER: a. See Exhibit A and Answer to Interrogatory No. 2.

b. Defendant is presently searching for records which might enable it to respond to section (b) of this Interrogatory and will supplement its answer accordingly upon conclusion of its investigation.

4. Please state what substance is used in place of asbestos in any of the products that were previously manufactured, distributed, or sold by Defendant with asbestos in them, but are presently sold without asbestos.

ANSWER: The asbestos previously used in thermal insulation products was replaced by a combination of glass and organic fibers.

5. Please state when the substitute for asbestos first became available to Defendant.

ANSWER: Defendant began manufacturing and shipping these products in 1972.

6. Did the Defendant at any time between 1952 and August, 1975 make or cause to be made any repairs or alterations of the product or similar products containing asbestos (hereinafter "the product")?

ANSWER: Defendant ceased the manufacture of asbestos-containing industrial thermal insulation products in 1974, with the exception of certain accessory items containing locked-in asbestos. See Exhibit A attached hereto.

7. If the answer to the preceding interrogatory is in the affirmative, please state and describe each such repair or alteration, including, but not limited to such information as:

- a. The date of each such repair or alteration
- b. The nature of the repairs or alterations made

- c. The names and addresses of the person having custody or control of the originals or copies of records, reports, memoranda, receipts, work orders or other written documents pertaining to the repairs made.

ANSWER: See Answer to Interrogatory No. 6

8. Are, or were, any of the ingredients in the product or similar products as marketed and distributed between 1952 and August, 1975, known or potential pulmonary irritants?

ANSWER: Defendant objects to this Interrogatory on the grounds that the form of the question is improper in that the use of the term "pulmonary irritants" is totally lacking in specificity, is totally unrelated to the issues at bar and would require total speculation for response thereto.

9. Please state:

- a. A complete description, including dates, number of subjects of any tests of safety of products containing asbestos made by the defendant or any laboratory hired by the defendants.
- b. The name, title, and address of the person in charge of each such test.
- c. For each such test not done in the Defendant's own laboratory, the name and address of the testing laboratory.
- d. The results of each such test.
- e. The name, title and last-known address of the person or persons who have custody of the records relating to each such test.

ANSWER: Defendant is uncertain as to Plaintiff's use of the term "tests of safety". However, in an effort to respond to Plaintiffs' Interrogatory and assuming Plaintiff is seeking information on the relevant issue of the biological effects of asbestos, Defendant submits the following information. Preliminary, the significant difference between "asbestos workers," usually meaning workers in asbestos factories where 100% asbestos fiber is processed, and the "insulation workers," or "insulators," who work with products containing 15% or less asbestos fiber, must be clearly understood. Those studies involving "insulators" are as follows:

In 1968, Johns-Manville joined in the establishment of the Insulation Industry Hygiene Research Program of Mt. Sinai Hospital. The purposes of this study are:

- (1) To develop improved methods for minimizing inhalation by insulation workers of dust and fumes encountered in their work;
- (2) To disseminate knowledge of those improved methods of dust and fume control wherever they may be applied advantageously; and
- (3) To offer cooperation, advice and assistance toward universal adoption of these methods.

The Program Director is Irving J. Selikoff, M. D., Director of the Environmental Sciences Laboratory, Mt. Sinai School of Medicine, New York, New York. These studies have not been concluded. Reports have been published from time to time and circulated to the trade through the union and are presumably available to Plaintiff's attorney through the Director of the Program, Dr. Irving J. Selikoff. In 1969-1970 at Defendant's Research and Engineering Center at Manville, New Jersey, tests were conducted for the Insulation Industry Hygiene Research Program by Thomas J. Weeks and Allen F. Burns. A copy of the report on such tests entitled "Performance of Dust Respirators against a Fibrous Dust" by Messrs. Weeks and Burns, published in American Industrial Hygiene Association Journal (May-June 1970), is available for copying at the office of Defendant's counsel.

Additionally, an epidemiological study of the biological effects of asbestos dust among the Port of Genoa and LaSpezia Arsenal insulation workers, among others, is being conducted by the Clinica del Lavoro, Milano, Italy, under the sponsorship of the Institute of Occupational and Environmental Health, which Institute in turn is funded by the Quebec Asbestos Mining Association. Defendant is the principal contributor to the funding of the Quebec Asbestos Mining Association. This study was initiated early in 1968. This study has generated the following:

"Research Project: Epidemiological Study on the Biological Effects of Asbestos Dust at the Balangero Mine and among the Port of Genoa and LaSpezia Arsenal Insulation Workers" by Enrico C. Vigliani (June 16, 1972), Report Clinica del Lavoro "Luigi Devoto," a copy of which is available for inspection and copying at the office of Defendant's counsel.

Defendant, through its membership in the National Insulation Manufacturers Association, has funded, in part, the studies conducted by Dr. Clark Cooper, et al. at the University of California at Berkeley. The following have been generated by this study:

"Industrial Hygiene for Insulation Workers", by J. Leroy Balzer, published in the Journal of Occupational Medicine (January, 1968), a copy of which is available for inspection and copying in the office of Defendant's counsel.

"Environmental Exposures in the Insulation Trade" by J. LeRoy Balzer, published in NICA Outlook (April, 1970), a copy of which is available for inspection and copying in the office of Defendant's counsel.

"Evaluation and Control of Asbestos Exposures in the Insulating Trade", by Clark W. Cooper and J. LeRoy Balzer, 2nd International Conference Biological Effects of Asbestos, Dresden, (1968), a copy of which is available for inspection and copying in the office of Defendant's counsel.

"Asbestos in Relation to the Type of Fibre and Dose in the Insulation Industry", by W. Clark Cooper and J. Miedema, LYON Conference (October, 1972), a copy of which is available for inspection and copying in the office of Defendant's counsel.

The first of the studies under the direction of Dr. Cooper, mentioned above, was published in the Journal of Occupational Medicine (January, 1968) and reported to numerous persons and entities, including the Eleventh Annual Western Industrial Health Conference. The second study directed by Dr. Cooper, referred to above, was published in the National Insulation Contractors Association's magazine Outlook during or about 1970.

- c. A full and complete description of the substance of the information which was received.

ANSWER: See Answer to Interrogatory No. 9.

13. On how many occasions prior to August, 1975, was the Defendant advised through his agents or employees that anyone had experienced an occurrence similar to the Plaintiff's occurrence with regard to similar products of the Defendant.

ANSWER: Defendant has no knowledge as to "Plaintiff's occurrence" or products to which Plaintiff might have been exposed, and accordingly is unable to responsibly respond to this Interrogatory at this time.

14. For each of the individuals referred to in the preceding interrogatory who experienced occurrences similar to the Plaintiff's occurrence, please give the following information:

- a. A complete identification, including name, address, telephone number and place of employment.
- b. The date of the occurrence.
- c. The location of the place where the occurrence happened.
- d. The reason given to any agent or employee of the defendant by the person who experienced the occurrence as to the cause of such occurrence.

ANSWER: See Answer to Interrogatory No. 13.

15. If there has ever been any litigation initiated against the defendant concerning the product, similar products or comparable products, please:

- a. Give the title and date of each such action.
- b. Outline the contents of the complaint filed in each such action.
- c. State the name and address of the court involved.
- d. Give the name and address of the attorney for the plaintiff in each such action.

ANSWER: See Exhibit B attached hereto for a list of litigation regarding asbestos-containing thermal insulation products. Included in that list is the caption of each case identifying the court in which the case is pending and the case number.

Defendant objects to the balance of this Interrogatory, as the same is a matter of public record contained in the court file of each respective case and available to Plaintiff.

16. Does the defendant contend that the defendant and all agents and employees of the defendant had no knowledge whatsoever of any hazard, danger, defect, or defective condition existing in the products or in the use of the products prior to the alleged occurrence of asbestosis in August, 1975?

ANSWER: No. In late, 1964, when Dr. Irving J. Selikoff, et al, made public the contents of a paper entitled "The Occurrence of Asbestosis Among Insulation Workers in the United States" by I. J. Selikoff, et al, published in the Annals of New York Academy of Sciences, Vo. 132, Art. 1 (Dec. 1965), the asbestos industry or the scientific or medical world perceived that there was a possible danger in the United States to the health of those working with and/or installing and/or applying finished industrial insulation products such as those manufactured by Defendants.

17. If the answer to the preceding interrogatory is in the negative, please identify all hazards, dangers, defects or defective conditions in the product of which the defendant, its agents, or its employees had knowledge prior to August, 1975, stating for each such hazard, danger, defect or defective condition:

- a. How the defendant or its agent or employee gained such knowledge.
- b. The identity, by name, address and job title of the agent or employee of the defendant who first acquired such knowledge.
- c. When such knowledge was acquired.
- d. A full description of the hazard, danger, defect or defective condition.

- e. The probable cause of the hazard, danger, defect or defective condition.
- f. The possible results of such hazard, danger, defect or defective condition which the defendant foresaw.

ANSWER: See Answer to Interrogatory No. 16.

18. Does the defendant claim that the existence of the hazard, danger, defect or defective condition in the product which allegedly caused the Plaintiff's injury was not foreseeable to the defendant prior to August, 1975?

Answer: See Answer to Interrogatory No. 16. The possible hazard or danger to insulation workers was not foreseeable prior to the Selikoff work in 1964.

ANSWER: 1. Defendant is aware of all of the publications or documents (a) through (l), inclusive, as set forth in this Interrogatory. It is impossible to state the precise date of awareness or the individual who first had knowledge of the publication. For all the publications listed (a) through (l) inclusive, Defendant's knowledge would have generally been contemporaneous with the publication of the document or within a reasonable time thereafter.

2. It is impossible to state with any precision action taken in response to any particular paper or publication except as otherwise hereinafter set forth. Publications in the medical/scientific literature cumulatively served to expand Defendant's awareness of what was known in the medical and scientific and governmental communities as to the biological effects of asbestos. The Dreessen study, item (f), recommended a threshold limit, which Defendant voluntarily accepted and adhered to. The Selikoff paper, item (i), was the first epidemiological study indicating a possible hazard to insulation workers exposed to asbestos-containing thermal insulation materials, and in response thereto, Defendant commenced labeling its asbestos-containing thermal insulation products in September, 1964. The Selikoff paper had the effect of contradicting and overruling the Fleischer paper, item (g), which had been the only prior epidemiological study of asbestos insulation workers and which had concluded that such occupation was relatively safe. In addition, and in response to the Selikoff paper, Defendants have participated in, and contributed to, the informational and educational program of the National Insulation Manufacturers Association. This program is designed to educate the insulation contractors' industry with respect to the health aspects of fibrous materials through regional meetings of insulation contractors'

associations. The purpose of these meetings is to aid the contractors in minimizing or eliminating the inhalation of, among other things, asbestos fibers by those working with and/or installing and/or applying the products of Defendant, Johns-Manville Products Corporation, and other manufacturers, i.e., industrial insulation applicators. In 1967, and again in 1968, programs have been presented at the regional meetings of industrial insulation contractors. Approximately 400 industrial insulation contractors have attended each year. These programs include a verbal review (of approximately three hours' duration) of the biological effects of fibrous materials, the threshold limit value of fibrous materials, methods for evaluating concentrations of dust, and engineering and method change recommendations to assist the contractors in dust abatement and environmental control. In addition to the verbal presentations, booklets have been prepared by the National Insulation Manufacturers Association (NIMA), largely through Defendant's participation and efforts. The booklet entitled "Recommended Safe Practices for Handling and Applying Thermal Insulation Products Containing Asbestos", printed May 1, 1968, described above was written by members of the NIMA Education and Information Committee. The Chairman of the Committee was Clifford L. Sheckler, who, at that time, was also Manager, Accident Prevention and Health Administration of Johns-Manville Corporation. Other members of the Committee included John Vyverberg, Owens-Corning Fiber Glass Corporation, Harry Mesler, Ruberoid Company; Leon Horowitz, Certain-teen Corporation; and Jack Barnhart, Executive Secretary of the National Insulation Manufacturers Association. The aforesaid booklet was produced and circulated during the 1968 meetings. Also, subsequent to the meetings with the contractors, considerable work has been done in conjunction with environmental control, especially in the area of fixed machinery and equipment.

In 1968, Johns-Manville joined in the establishment of the Insulation Industry Hygiene Research Program of Mt. Sinai Hospital. The purposes of this study are:

In response to the passage of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, item (1), as the same related to asbestos, the Company complied with the provisions of such law.

20. Does the defendant consider the product or similar products dangerous?

ANSWER: Asbestos-containing thermal insulation products can be safely handled and used.

21. Please list and identify all items of printed or published materials including data sheets and test results by or for the defendant which refer to the uses, safety and side effects of the product or similar products, and with respect to each such item, please state:

- (a) The date it was distributed or printed.
- (b) The manner in which it was distributed.
- (c) The name, title and address of its author and the nature of his relationship to the defendant.

ANSWER: Since approximately 1940, Defendants have, on a continuing basis, furnished customers information as to the proper use and application of its insulating products. Answering Defendant and affiliates have directly or indirectly advised industrial insulation contractors to utilize ventilation equipment, good housekeeping procedures, and personal protective equipment, such as respirators, at the sites where finished insulation products were being worked with and applied. Those respirators which have been recommended are approved by NIOSH (formerly the responsibility of the United States Bureau of Mines) for use as protection against pneumoconiosis-producing dusts.

Defendants have also affixed caution instructions to its industrial thermal insulation products which contain asbestos and

which might release dust upon application regarding the handling of these products described in answer to Interrogatory No. 22.

Defendants also distributed to customers copies of the following booklet providing instructions designed to reduce health and safety risks in the fabrication, handling and application of asbestos products.

"Recommended Health Safety Practices for Handling and Applying Thermal Insulation Products Containing Asbestos" (1968), a copy of which is available for copying in the office of Defendant's counsel.

Defendants have participated in, and contributed to, the informational and educational program of the National Insulation Manufacturers Association. This program is designed to educate the insulation contractors' industry with respect to the health aspect of fibrous materials through regional meetings of insulation contractors' associations. The purpose of these meetings is to aid the contractors in minimizing or eliminating the inhalation of, among other things, asbestos fibers by those working with and/or installing and/or applying the products of Defendant, Johns-Manville Products Corporation, and other manufacturers, i.e., industrial insulation applicators. In 1967, and again in 1968, programs have been presented at the regional meetings of industrial insulation contractors. Approximately 400 industrial insulation contractors have attended each year. These programs include a verbal review (of approximately three hours' duration) of the biological effects of fibrous materials, the threshold limit value of fibrous materials, methods of evaluating concentrations of dust, and engineering and method change recommendations to assist the contractors in dust abatement and environmental control. In addition to the verbal presentations, booklets have been prepared by the National Insulation Manufacturers Association (NIMA), largely through Defendant's participation and efforts. The booklet entitled "Recommended Safe Practices for Handling and Applying Thermal Insulation Products Containing Asbestos", printed May 1, 1968, described above, was written by members of the NIMA Education and Information Committee. 22. On any occasion has the defendant given a warning to users of the product or similar products or taken other activities in regard to possible dangers in the use thereof:

ANSWER: Defendant placed warning notices on the packaging of its thermal insulation products which contained asbestos which might release dust upon installation. The warning labels and the dates of use are as follows:

CAUTION

THIS PRODUCT CONTAINS ASBESTOS FIBER.

INHALATION OF ASBESTOS IN EXCESSIVE
QUANTITIES OVER LONG PERIODS OF TIME
MAY BE HARMFUL.

IF DUST IS CREATED WHEN THIS PRODUCT
IS HANDLED, AVOID BREATHING THE DUST.

IF ADEQUATE VENTILATION CONTROL IS NOT
POSSIBLE, WEAR RESPIRATORS APPROVED BY
THE U.S. BUREAU OF MINES FOR PNEUMOCO-
NIOSIS-PRODUCING DUSTS.

These warnings or some modification thereof were used on the packaging of all industrial thermal insulation products of Defendant which contain asbestos which might release dust upon application. Use of warning labels was commenced during 1964. Defendant used such warning notices because in 1964, it was reported by a member of the medical profession that there might exist a risk to some persons who installed industrial insulation products containing asbestos, in that inhalation of excessive quantities of asbestos fibers over prolonged periods of time under certain conditions might create a risk of the contracting of asbestos is to some persons. This pamphlet was distributed to all employees at all locations using asbestos fiber or handling products containing asbestos fiber.

An employee notification form entitled "Dear Johns-Manville Employee", published by Johns-Manville Sales Corporation, a copy of which is available for inspection and/or copying at the office of Defendants' attorneys. This was inserted in paychecks of all employees at all Johns-Manville Sales Corporation contract units beginning in 1970.

Since 1976, Defendant has made available a Catalog of Occupational/Environmental Health and Safety Programs as listed below. All the publications, audio-visual programs and other material listed in this catalog are available to Johns-Manville customers and public interest groups as well as to all Johns-Manville personnel.

A pamphlet entitled, "Occupational Health Guide - Asbestos", published by Johns-Manville in 1976, a copy of which is available for inspection and/or copying at the office of Defendants' attorneys. This guide is designed as a reference for supervisory personnel.

A 25-minute slide/tape presentation on industrial hygiene programs at Johns-Manville.

A 20-minute slide/tape program on health aspects of working with asbestos.

A 25-minute motion picture on occupational health risks associated with asbestos fiber.

A newspaper entitled, "The Asbestos Report", published by Johns-Manville in 1976, a copy of which is available for inspection and/or copying at the office of Defendants' attorneys.

In addition, over the several years last past, there have been many oral presentations and meetings at the plant level concerning safety practices related to asbestos exposure.

Also, Defendant has cooperated with the Asbestos Information Association in the production of the following booklets:

"Recommended Work Practices - Molding and Fabrication of Asbestos-Containing Plastic Products".

"Recommended Work Practices - Fabrication and Use of Asbestos Friction Materials".

"Recommended Work Practices - Fabrication and Use of Asbestos Paper Products".

"Recommended Work Practices - Shop and Field Fabrication of Asbestos Sheet Products".

"Recommended Work Practices - Use and Handling of Asbestos Textile Products".
