Dear Mr. Mittnacht:

One of the things which I have planned to do at once is to rewrite the entire set of Rules and Regulations, including a number of additional matters which will not be particularly important in the United States, but will be very useful in Europe. I planned to write these up essentially for European use and to have them translated and printed in at least four languages. I would suggest the inadvisability, therefore, of your sending the new regulations which have just been printed to Europe to replace those which are already in the field. If additional supplies are required in Europe, these should be sent but they should not be sent out to all of the points to replace the old ones until I have finished the job and am ready to put out a complete new set. Moreover, it is not necessary for the present to replace the printed cards with the new ones. I am not even sure that it is necessary to do this for the United States. I would suggest, therefore, that you do nothing further about printing and distributing new rules until you hear further from me.
