name for themselves in any walk of life.
Clifford V. Gregory, editor of The Prairie Farmer, originator of the master farmer idea, holds that the increasing number of farmers who have become conspicuously successful indicates the high plane to which American agriculture is ascending and is evidence that scientific information is extending as a basis of farm operations.

Seventeen States
During 1927 master farmer studies were conducted in Oklahoma, Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, Iowa, Illinois, Nebraska, Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wisconsin, Montana, Alabama, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee and Texas. In each case the honor sought the man. Friends and neighbors nominated him, competent judges studied his work and awards were made from the standpoint of profession, business, citizenship and manhood.

The ideals for which the master farmers stand include efficiency in production, increased fertility of the soil, the assurance of a competency for the farmer and his family, development of fine home and community life and a definite rural culture on American farms.

Jardine Complimentary
"These men," says Secretary of Agriculture Jardine, "have put into farming the same ability, initiative, business sense and enterprise that have brought the industrial and commercial life of the nation to its present high position. It is an inspiration to the boys and girls who are growing up in the country to know that success may be the reward of effort on the farm. It is in the city—not only the success that is measured in money, but what is more important, the success that comes from an upright and useful life in the family and community."

Among the 1927 master farmers chosen for Minnesota, the Dakotas, and Wisconsin, are six men whose net wealth is between \$50,000 and \$75,000. Five of these men accumulated their wealth almost exclusively through their own efforts. Master farmers in Kansas have averaged 41 bushels of corn to the acre when the state's average was but -7 bushels; and in Oklahoma 25 bushels, of wheat to the acre when the state's average was 14 bushels.

San Luis Creek Bridge Bids Asked

SACRAMENTO, April 20 (AP).—state highway commission will open bids May 9 for the construction of a reinforced concrete girder bridge to span San Luis Obispo creek three and one-half miles south of San Luis Obispo, it was announced today. Approaches to the bridge also will be macadamized.

Bids for grading between Arroyo Secuito and Los Alisos, Los Angeles county will be opened April 18, and April 25 will bring the opening of bids for extension of Bayshore highway from Burlingame to San Mateo, San Mateo county.

Bids soon will be called for grading and surfacing nine-tenths of a mile of line change at Galivan, Orange county, and for grading and surfacing one mile of the Santa Fe line change, San Luis Obispo county.
