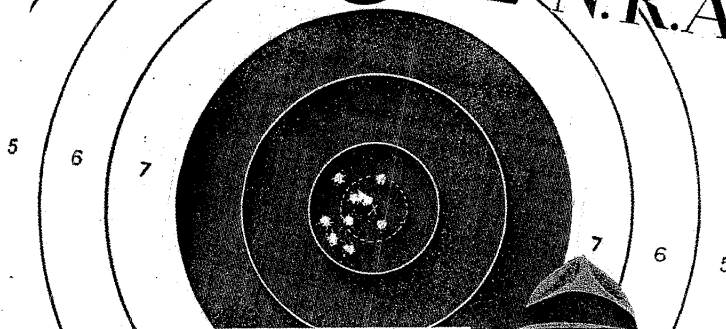


George Bergman Shoots .22 N.R.A.'s
