Afternoon [REDACTED],

Thank you for the feedback and arranging the visit yesterday. We thought the visit went well and was useful for us to discuss PFAS and complexity of our site. Also, thank you for the offer advice and support on PFAS issues and adverse media campaigns (but let's hope we don't get to that!).

No problem for the regulatory tourism, it's important that the Environment Agency understand our processes and we fully support working collaboratively with you. We feel 1/2 day may not be enough time for detailed process explanation, suggest extending this to 1 day. We are available 16th May or 25/26th May - would any of these dates work for your team? This would give enough time for a 'Chemistry Lesson' by [REDACTED] lunch and site tour to go through the process from R22 delivery to ETFE/PTFE product.

We are doing some investigating on setting up a Teams site to enable us to share documents with you. This shouldn't be a problem. Please could you confirm if this needs to be a system that does not allow the EA to download or add documents – as these will be classed as being available to the EA and hence in the public domain?

Also, I'll get the Part A for process gas emissions to you on Tuesday and still need to complete Part P for annual CO emission breach.
