In keeping with our telephone conversation, I am supplying you herewith with a letter and complete report supplied by Dr. Kehoe referring to the General American Tank Storage Terminals tank condition problem at Goodhope, Louisiana. You will agree that the data should be explained to Mr. Cassard and I am pleased that you are willing to handle this assignment for us while you are in the Louisiana area.

Although this is personal, I do not feel that we have been able to give Mr. Cassard any definite information- our observations merely indicate the presence of lead in varying proportions in scale and sludge, they do not show that a tank cleaned in a given manner becomes safe for the storage of edible products. Unfortunately, motor oil does not have the same absorbent qualities as edible oil.

After you have visited Mr. Cassard, will you be kind enough to supply us with a report in which kindly state their wishes to continue or discontinue our investigation and/or plans for edible oil storage, etc.

Since you are planning to visit Dr. Kehoe in Cincinnati in the near future, it would be desirable for you to discuss this matter with him in person.

Please return the correspondence to us after it has served its purpose. Best regards.
