Whitney Palace To Be Razed

NEW YORK, April 11. (U.P.)—The public was invited today to see the fabulous palace of the multi-millionaire Whitney family before it becomes another legend in the dwindling row of private palaces on Fifth Avenue.

The five-story structure will be demolished; its ceilings, walls and tapestries, collected from the palaces of Europe, will be auctioned. In its place probably will be built, after the war, another of the apartment houses which have been crowding out the mansions of the wealthy.

It will be opened to the public on April 27 and 28. The auction will be held on the following two days, but it may be attended only by card.

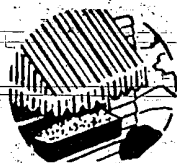
The palace was built in 1900 for William C. Whitney, father of Harry Payne Whitney. Harry Payne Whitney married Gertrude Vanderbilt and they lived in it for 20 years, until Whitney died in 1930. Since then, Mrs. Whitney, one of the wealthiest women in the world has lived on her Long Island estate, maintaining a town house in Greenwich Village.

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Importation of Mexican Labor Is Considered

BERKELEY, Cal., April 11. (U.P.) The state war board of the U.S. department of agriculture said today it would favor importation of Mexican laborers for California harvest work if the present emergency farm labor mobilization drive did not provide the number of workers needed.

Dave Davidson, board chairman said recommendations had been sent Secretary of Agriculture Claude Wickard asking appropriate preliminary arrangements be made to facilitate quick movements of workers from across the border in an emergency.

"Any contemplated importation of Mexican workers should be on the basis of wartime emergency only, and provision should be made for the return of the workers to Mexico after the war" the board statement said.

The statement emphasized the board was not recommending such importation "unless the U.S. employment service determines the critical farm labor shortage can not otherwise be alleviated."
