Dear Mr. Mittnacht:

I enclose herewith some paid bills in the amount of \$400.40 which represent my expenditures in the study of one Mr. [REDACTED] of Gravelbourg, Saskatchewan, Canada, a suspected case of lead poisoning. In accordance with my letter to Mr. Webb of some days ago, I felt that the complete study of this man under hospital conditions was absolutely necessary for the purpose of arriving at a diagnosis. I therefore had him come to Cincinnati at my expense, I paying his traveling expenses and his hospital bill.

I enclose also an accounting of my indebtedness to you for the advances made at various times, and for the interest for which you sent me an invoice November 21. I enclose my personal check in the amount of \$47.93 to clear up my indebtedness. I trust that this corresponds to the accounting which is shown on your books and that we are now square up to January 1.

I have been working out the details of my budget for the ensuing year and I will send to you in the course of the next day or two an itemized account of these matters for your study and consideration.

As soon as I have finished the analytical results in the case of Mr. [REDACTED] I will supply you with a complete record of all the findings, of my own conclusions, and the conclusions of all of the physicians who have seen Mr. Pierson. Any action that I may recommend in this instance will depend upon the outcome of the analyses which are now under way.
