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Plumas National Forest Fire Under Control

The worse of two fires that have
crackled through Northern Califor-
nia forests for nearly a week was
reported "in good shape" yesterday
afternoon.

E. L. Baxter, regional fire dis-
patcher for the U. S. Forest Service,
said the Plumas National Forest
fire had been brought under con-
trol but that "we still have a lot
of work to do."

He said 1000 men—a peak of 1300
were on the job Friday—were still
spread along the 55-mile fire line.

The blaze destroyed 35,000,000
board feet of timber valued at
\$900,000.

The only other troublesome fire
in Northern California, Baxter
said, was the Boardman Ridge blaze
burning over 3400 acres in Men-
docino county.

The forest fire on San Geronio has thus far blackened 8700 acres,
reaching southwestward as far as
Mias canyon and to within four
miles of Big Oaks on the north
side.

Rangers said Mias canyon is a
heavily populated district and resi-
dents have been warned to remove
their horses and cattle and evacu-
ate the area. Officials said that one
firefighter was "badly hurt" and
was being taken out by helicopter.

The new fire, which started near
Banning cemetery and spread
across 350 acres in the first half
hour, has destroyed two homes and
a fire truck, State Forestry men
said.

Townpeople, including Banning's
Mayor Chester Hendricks were
fighting for their homes. Ranches
threatened included those of Ar-
thur Gilman and Otis Stockton.

H. H. McCoy, and City Councilman



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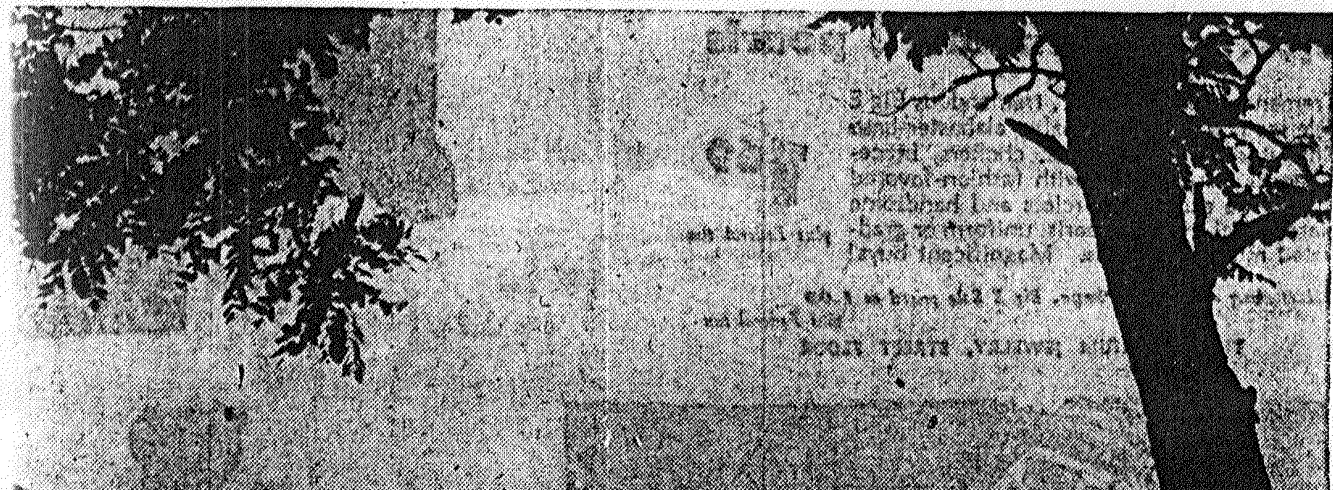
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
