We might want to defer the re-start of periodic PI conference calls until after the QA/QC initiative has gotten up and running... The QA/QC team already faces strong competition for PI availability, including travel (Richard returns to Shanghai tomorrow, Otto returns next week), end-of-study activities (e.g., developing or receiving the preliminary CC data set) and SRP-Subteam discussions re: case ascertainment / ERP-Subteam inquiries re: informed consent). If the TC has specific questions - perhaps stemming from mid-year progress reports - I could try to schedule a one-off conference call with PIs.

Might it instead be useful to schedule a monthly Technical Committee conference call with Jerry Rice, in lieu of monthly PI calls during 3Q 2007 - given Jerry's leadership role on the SRP/ERP panels and QA/QC team?

Now that the contract issues have been settled I wondered if we could get back to our previous modus operandi for the BHRC Technical Committee to have occasional but regular calls with the PIs for review and update. For instance Stuart & I had each taken the lead previously on calls with Otto & Richard respectively, with other TC members participating in these as schedules permitted. With the interdependency of the DP and CC studies in terms of data transfer it may make more sense now to have combined calls with Otto & Richard - again for purposes of update, identifying any potential hurdles and to facilitate exchange.
