Dear Mr. Webb:

Your letter of February 21 in regard to the situation of the Standard Oil of Indiana looks very encouraging to me, however I do not believe that the Board of Directors of the Indiana Company appreciate fully the degree to which their equipment is unsatisfactory. I am sure they do not realize that there is not a single one of their installations that comes up to our present minimum requirements.

In order that we may have all of the details of the situation in hand I have asked Mr. Siebenthaler to visit all of the Indiana points in accordance with your suggestion. We will make a complete report up to date with exact recommendations as to how they may bring their equipment up to at least our minimum requirements. It will require about ten days to obtain all this information but, though I do not think there have been significant changes since my last records, it will be worth the while and trouble to have the exact facts.
