1b.	29 CFR 1910.93a (f)(3)	Air samples have not been taken of the work environment of Machine Repair during blower maintenance and repair, at intervals of not more than six (6) months, in order to foresee possible employee exposure to asbestos fibers in excess of the permissible levels. 2a.	29 CFR 1910.93a (g)(1)(i)	Caution signs have not been displayed in the areas in Machine Repair when airborne concentrations of asbestos fibers may be in excess of prescribed limits.	July 24, 1974

On the basis of the inspection it is alleged that you have violated the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 29 U.S.C. 651 et seq., in the following respects:

30	29 CFR 1910.93a (3)(6)	The employer does not maintain complete and accurate records of all medical examinations.	July 24, 1975
4.	29 CFR 1910.95	Employee's operating furnaces and forming operations, lines K-4 and J-6, are exposed to sound levels which exceed the permissible limits in Table G-16 of 29 CFR 1910.95. A continuing and effective hearing conservation program is not being administered. Effective controls as may be immediately practicable for the temporary protection of employees pending accomplishment of permanent abatement. By June 30, 1974 develop and implement a continuing and effective hearing conservation program which will protect employees exposed to levels in excess of 90 dBA from suffering continuing deterioration of hearing acuity and which insures that incipient loss of hearing will be detected and necessary steps taken to prevent further deterioration before serious hearing loss occurs. Prior to May 30, 1975 conduct engineering studies to determine method and feasibility of permanent engineering controls involving equipment and facility changes and administrative controls involving rotation of employees and procedural changes, with the object of reducing sound level exposures insofar as feasible. By May 30, 1975 complete implementation of all feasible permanent engineering or administrative controls to reduce ambient sound level in the hearing zones of employees to the levels specified in Table G-16, or insofar as possible. Provide the Area Director with a copy of the engineering study as soon as it is completed and with detailed reports of the progress of implementation of permanent engineering and administrative controls on 15th day of each month until implementation is completed.	By May 30, 1975 provide interim protection by effective hearing protection devices and such administrative controls as may be immediately practicable for the temporary protection of employees pending accomplishment of permanent abatement.
