Dear Mr. Dunn:

In order to keep our record of activities complete I wish to give herewith a brief account of a meeting which Dr. Horwitt and I had December 4th in my laboratory with representatives of the Wm. Wrigley Company.

The following chemists participated in our conference: Messrs. Schultz, H. P. Guest and A.E. Guest of the Wrigley Company, and Mr. R. Dykeman of the Dreyfuss Company, a subsidiary of the Wrigley organization.

At this conference the matter of methods for the determination of "X" was discussed with particular reference to the question of one suited for use in the field work to be done in Mexico. Mr. Dykeman was to leave promptly for Mexico and one of the other gentlemen was to follow him shortly prepared to make some analyses in Mexico. After a general discussion the group went from my office to the laboratory and was given a demonstration by Dr. Horwitt of his dithizone method for determination of "X", and these chemists made many written notes of the same. It is our understanding that these notes will be edited and returned to Dr. Horwitt for correction.

We were given to understand that these men had spent the previous day in Dr. Kehoe's laboratory in Cincinnati discussing with him the proper methods for collecting materials in the field for analysis of "X".

If any copies of this report are desired, I assume that Mr. Yates is prepared to make them.
