Dear Mrs. Mussey:

At the request of the Ohio Industrial Commission, I examined [REDACTED] on March 27th of this year for the purpose of determining whether he had any residual occupational illness as the result of exposure to lead compounds. I was unable to find any evidence of disability of occupational or other origin. It is quite possible that this man did not have lead poisoning at any time although his exposure to lead was of such a sort that intoxication might have developed. However, he has no present evidence of abnormal lead exposure nor does he have any illness of a type which is associated with occupational lead exposure. In my opinion Mr. [REDACTED] is quite able to work although, by reason of his idleness, he would probably find hard work difficult until he becomes accustomed to it again. He is distinctly not unemployable from the point of view of physical disability, and in my opinion he would profit considerably by being put to work.
