My dear Mr. Sanford:

At the meeting of the executive committee of the National Safety Council a few weeks ago it was suggested that there might be prepared for publication in the National Safety News a brief statement of measures which can be relied upon to protect the worker from dust hazards and abrasive pressure blasting and I was asked to prepare a preliminary draft of such a statement. I enclose my attempt herewith. It was suggested that this preliminary statement should be submitted to half a dozen members of the executive committee who have special experience in this field to ask for their criticism.
