Dear Mr. Shattuck:

I am enclosing herewith the original letter from Mr. Wormser, Secretary and Treasurer of the Lead Industries Association, to Dr. Aub, in which is promised a gift of \$10,000. to the Medical School for work on lead poisoning to cover a period of two years. (You will find some writing on the bottom of the letter which should be neglected. It is merely a note that Dr. Aub put on when he sent the letter to Dr. Fairhall for his information.)

We have had dealings with the lead people before and they have given quite generously repeatedly. This I look upon as being a very final guarantee of the sum that they mention.

When the money is received, Dr. Aub, who secured the money, wishes it arranged that \$8,000. of it should be subject to the requisition of Dr. Fairhall, and \$2,000. only subject to Dr. Aub's personal requisition. When we receive word of the receipt of the money, I will note that point again in writing to you.

I am also enclosing herewith the original letter from Mr. Mallinckrodt to Dr. Hallowell Davis, in which he guarantees \$1,500. for the work that Dr. Forbes and Dr. Davis are doing in research on anaesthesia. Dr. Forbes and Dr. Davis have arranged to use \$500. of this for the payment of a man already in the department for continuing his work for a longer period than it otherwise would be possible, and \$1,000. for the salary of an especially trained young woman who is now in England. This money should be designated Gift for Research in Anaesthesia. The application of the money to these two salaries I shall give you later when it is definitely arranged.

I thought it also well to enclose herewith the original letter from Dr. Forbes to me in regard to this matter, for the reason that in the second paragraph of this letter Dr. Forbes himself guarantees to pay the passage money of Miss Rempel from

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this country back to Germany, where her parents are living, next year provided Mr. Mallinckrodt does not see fit to renew this stipend for the year 1965-66.

I forgot to say that the gift of \$10,000. from the Lead Industries Association should be designated The Lead Fund.
