Telephone message from Mr. Byron, as dictated by him.

Mr. McClarran, Manchester City Architect, telephoned me yesterday to ask whether the spray operatives could work during the day-time on the decorative fitting only. I have spoken to Mr. Robertson of Hamilton and Cilsore, and confirmed what they intend to do. I felt that this was in order in view of the low dust concentrations taken when spraying asbestos was in progress. So I telephoned the City Architect and spoke to Mr. Happell, Deputy City Architect and advised him what I thought. Mr. Happell, however, would prefer to see the figures obtained by us before giving his authority to the spray taking place during the daytime. Mr. Happell has told me that the Medical Officer of Health has written to Dr. Holmes requesting these figures. Naturally he would like to have the figures as soon as possible.

(Whether you decide to send the figures for the 30th August and the 3rd September remains to be seen. Mr. Byron would think that it would be in order to send the 3rd September only).
