CONSEQUENCES OF EXPOSURE TO TOXIC AMOUNTS

COMPOUND: ASBESTOS

EYES: CONTACT WITH THE DUST CAN CAUSE MECHANICAL IRRITATION
SIMILAR TO THAT CAUSED BY ANY SOLID PARTICLE.

SKIN: UNLIKE FIBROUS GLASS, THE FIBERS DO NOT CAUSE DISCOMFORT
OR MECHANICAL IRRITATION.

INGESTION: SOME EVIDENCE SUGGESTS THAT LONG TERM INGESTION OF
ASBESTOS MAY INCREASE CHANCES OF STOMACH CANCER.

DUST INHALATION: SHORT TERM: HIGH CONCENTRATIONS (WELL ABOVE ACCEPTABLE
LEVELS) MAY CAUSE ONLY MODERATE DISCOMFORT FROM
MECHANICAL IRRITATION.

LONG TERM: THE FIBERS CAN CAUSE SCARRING OF THE
LUNGS (ASBESTOSIS). A CANCER OF THE CHEST LINING
(MESOTHELIOMA) MAY ALSO RESULT FROM ASBESTOS EXPOSURE.
MOST IMPORTANT, ASBESTOS EXPOSURE AND CIGARETTE
SMOKING GREATLY INCREASE THE RISK OF LUNG CANCER.
