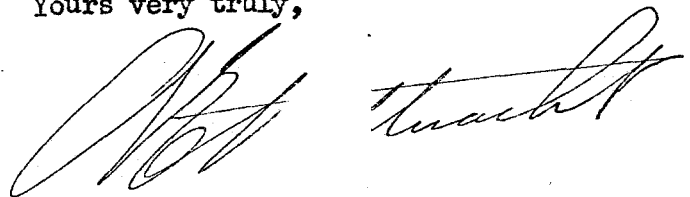

The Standard Oil Company of Louisiana has advised us as a matter of information that during a recent investigation at Baton Rouge by your medical staff objections were raised to the practice of using the same group of men for handling both Benzol and Lead.

The Standard Oil Company of New Jersey has given this matter some study and we are pleased to advise that instructions have been issued to the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey refineries whereby those men mixing Ethyl Gasoline will not handle Benzol.
