I was greatly interested in yours of August 9th and the theory you propound as to why the dust from the separating mill is relatively inert in such striking contrast with that produced in connection with the spinning and weaving operations. I believe you have probably hit on the right answer, since it is true that the asbestos has to be opened up and fluffed out before it can be used for weaving.
